### **Depression 101**

- Major depressive disorder (major depression)
- Psychotic depression
- Postpartum depression (postnatal depression)
- SAD (seasonal affective disorder)
- Bipolar disorder (manic-depressive illness)

## **Causes of Depression**

- Genetics (genotype/phenotype)
- Environment
- Hormones
- Biology- serotonin, dopamine, norepinephrine

## **Depression Effects**

- Costly and debilitating to sufferers.
- Adversely affects the course and outcome of common chronic conditions
- Increased work absenteeism, short-term disability, and decreased productivity

### Who Tends to be Most Depressed?

- persons 45-64 years of age
- women
- persons with less than a high school education
- those previously married
- individuals unable to work or unemployed
- persons without health insurance coverage
- blacks, Hispanics, non-Hispanic persons of other races or  $\bullet$ multiple races

## **Brief Statistics**

- 1 in 10 U.S. Adults Report Depression
- Major depressive disorder is a chronic disorder for most blacks.
- Blacks with depression reported higher levels of functional impairment than whites.

### Discrimination



## Poverty

 In 2010, 27.4 percent of blacks and 26.6 percent of Hispanics were poor, compared to 9.9 percent of non-Hispanic whites and 12.1 percent of Asians.

National Poverty Center

- Humiliation from subsidies
- Poor living environment
- Frustrated because cannot pursue goals
- Crime
- Parents in jail
- Failing foster care system



# Single Parenting

- In the African American community, <u>72 percent of Black</u> <u>children are raised in a single</u> <u>parent household</u>.(Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development, 2011)
- Must do the job of two parents
- Not enough emotional supportcompanionship
- Not enough dads, gives us enraged boys and vulnerable girls



## Gun Violence and PTSD

July 2013, CDC, Nearly four ullettimes as many young murder victims in the United States were killed by firearms than by other methods such as stabbing, strangling or poisoning, in the past 30 years.





## Body Image

- African American women have the highest rates of being overweight or <u>obese</u> compared to other groups in the U.S. About four out of five African American women are overweight or obese.(Office of Minority Health)
- Skin color

- Eating disorders



### Incest

- Less likely to report
- Self esteem
- Arrested development
- PTSD
- Drug Abuse
- Dissociative Disorders
- Schizoaffective
- Borderline personality



## LGBT

- 3 times the suicide rate for youth
- Black community still in closet
- Unsafe sex
- Drug abuse



## Diet

- Comfort food –serotonin high and dependence
- Less food choices
- Obesity- physical complications
- Less mobility



# Stigma

- Therapy is a white thing
- I don't need to see a therapist I'm not crazy
- Perceived as weakness
- Church or house of worship




## Lack of Insurance
